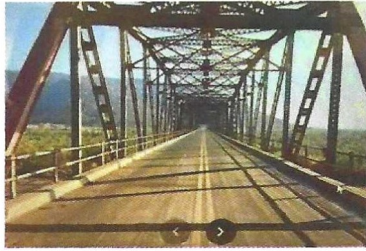

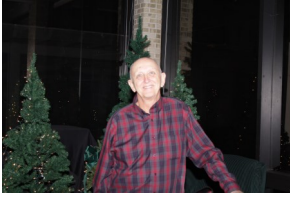


Secretary's Notes

Safety Officer

A Motorcycle First Aid Kit has special needs. All noted is only a suggestion. You can vary the contents of your kit as you see fit.

An ordinary first aid kit just won't cut it. This is mainly to do with size, but also the types of common injuries that riders may experience.

Common injuries for motorcycle riders are:

- Burns - sunburn and heat burns, minor and less common major, from exhaust pipes and other sources.
- Eye injuries - things flying or blowing into the eyes.
- Cuts, Abrasions and scrapes - usually from hitting the road literally.
- Fractures.

When packing a Motorcycle First Aid Kit, or looking to buy one, consider kit contents that are used for stopping bleeding, treating burns, abrasions and cuts and eye injuries.

It is important to know the purpose of and how to use every item in your motorcycle first aid kit - otherwise it's just taking up space. Store them in zip-lock bags of different sizes. This really helps on keeping things organized.

Here's my Motorcycle First Aid Kit Checklist:

Contents:

Bag 1 Misc. sized band-aids (20) Large Butterfly bandages (5)
Bag 2 Medicated wipes (10). Neosporin anti-biotic ointment (5)
Bag 3 One eye cup and Ocu-fresh eye wash (2) (eye cup is optional)
Bag 4 Off Deep woods insect repellent towelettes (6) Sun screen towelettes 50 spf (4)
Bag 5 Small Utility tape, Surgical tapes (paper and stronger type), Stainless steel scissors
Tweezer, Hemostat clamp, Roll of stretch gauze 2inch (2) Roll of stretch gauze 2" x4.1 yrd (2),
Surgical dressing pads 5"x9" (2), Trauma pad 5x9 (2), Gauze sponges 4x4 (4)

Misc. Items:

Non-stick dressings 4"x3" (2)
Survival wrap (heat reflective blanket)
Shoe strings (2)
Sterile water (optional)
Latex Gloves (2 pair)
Cloth Diaper (very absorbent material)
Cold pack.



Of course, the big trick is getting all this stuff in a container small enough to actually fit in the saddlebag. Look for soft sided waterproof zipper cases. And believe it or not you should be able to get all this stuff in a bag about 20 x 13 x 8 cm (7" x 5" x 3"). It can be done!

Be safe and ride.

Overview:

Motorcycle riders continue to be overrepresented in fatal traffic crashes. In 2022, there were 6,218 motorcyclists killed - 15% of all traffic fatalities. NHTSA data show that this is the highest number of motorcyclists killed since at least 1975. To keep everyone safe, we urge drivers and motorcyclists to share the road and be alert, and we're reminding motorcyclists to make themselves visible, to use DOT-compliant motorcycle helmets, and to always ride sober.

Riding in the Heat – Safety Tips

With the Arizona heat rising, here are some tips to help you stay cool and comfortable on the road:

- **Hydrate!** Drink plenty of water *before* you ride, and bring extra with you.
- **Avoid peak heat** by riding early in the morning or later in the afternoon.
- Plan your **breaks and fuel stops** around shaded areas when possible.
- Wear **vented or mesh riding gear** to stay cool without sacrificing safety.
- **Perforated leather** offers protection and airflow.
- Choose **breathable riding boots** to protect your feet while allowing heat to escape.
